The notion of 'Political Discourse' does not remain limited to the 'institutional' field of politics (e.g., parliamentary discourse, election campaigns, party programmes, speeches, etc.) but opens to all linguistic manifestations that may be considered to be political, provided that it can be argued what makes them 'political'. Inter- and transdisciplinary perspectives and elaborated linguistic methodologies complement each other in order to illuminate new and old forms of political discourse.
